Dear Mr. President:

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed Senate Bill 345.

This bill authorizes a district court commissioner to exercise the powers of office in a county in another district that is contiguous to the county in which the commissioner resides, if so assigned by the chief judge of the district court. A district court commissioner may also exercise the powers of office in another county within the commissioner's district that is contiguous to the county in which the commissioner resides, if so assigned by an administrative commissioner.

House Bill 851, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me on April 28, 1998, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign Senate Bill 345.
