In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed Senate Bill 496.

This bill allows Baltimore City to grant a tax credit against county property taxes imposed on the personal property owned by the Northwest Family Sport Center, Incorporated.

House Bill 1291, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me on April 28, 1998, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign Senate Bill 496.

Senate Bill No. 496

AN ACT concerning

Baltimore City - Property Tax Credit - Northwest Family Sport Center, Inc.

FOR the purpose of authorizing the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore City to grant, by law, a property tax credit against the county property tax imposed on personal property that is owned by the Northwest Family Sport Center, Inc.

BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

Article - Tax - Property
Section 9-304(b)
Annotated Code of Maryland
(1994 Replacement Volume and 1997 Supplement)

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Tax - Property

9-304.

(b) The Mayor and City Council of Baltimore City may grant, by law, a property tax credit under this section against the county property tax imposed on:

(1) real property that is leased, occupied, and used only by the Baltimore Association for Retarded Citizens, Incorporated; AND
