(2) PERSONAL PROPERTY THAT IS OWNED BY THE NORTHWEST FAMILY SPORT CENTER, INC.

Dear Mr. President:

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed Senate Bill 508.

This bill merges the Maryland Port Administration (MPA) police force into the Maryland Transportation Authority (MdTA). The MdTA police force would henceforth provide police services to the MPA at MPA facilities. MPA police officers become members of the MdTA police force without diminution in salary and are eligible to become members of the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System.

House Bill 795, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me on May 12, 1998, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign Senate Bill 508.

Transportation - Police Forces - Maryland Transportation Authority Police

FOR the purpose of consolidating the Maryland Port Administration Police Force into the Maryland Transportation Authority Police Force; authorizing the Maryland Transportation Authority Police Force to exercise certain powers and provide certain services; providing that certain members of the Maryland Port Administration Police Force shall become members of the Maryland Transportation Authority Police Force without diminution of certain rights and benefits under certain conditions; authorizing certain Maryland Port Authority Police officers to become members of the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System by a certain date; providing for certain exceptions; and generally relating to the Maryland Transportation Authority Police Force.
