House Bill No. 196

AN ACT concerning

Consumer Protection - "Lemon Law" - Required Notice

FOR the purpose of requiring the Motor Vehicle Administration to develop a notice that describes the rights provided to consumers under the Maryland Automotive Warranty Enforcement Act; requiring the Motor Vehicle Administration to make the notice available to dealers that sell new motor vehicles in the State; specifying the manner in which the notice is to be written and certain contents of the notice; requiring the Motor Vehicle Administration to adopt regulations to implement this Act; requiring certain dealers to provide a copy of the notice to purchasers of new motor vehicles at a certain time; requiring the Motor Vehicle Administration to consult with the Consumer Protection Division of the Office of the Attorney General in developing the consumer notice; and generally relating to providing notice of the rights and remedies available under the Maryland Automotive Warranty Enforcement Act.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Commercial Law

14-1502.1.

(A) THE MOTOR VEHICLE ADMINISTRATION SHALL:

(1) DEVELOP A NOTICE THAT DESCRIBES THE RIGHTS PROVIDED TO CONSUMERS UNDER THIS SUBTITLE;

(2) MAKE THE NOTICE AVAILABLE TO ALL DEALERS THAT SELL NEW MOTOR VEHICLES IN THE STATE; AND

(3) ADOPT REGULATIONS AS NECESSARY TO IMPLEMENT THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION.

(B) THE NOTICE SHALL:
