

(1) BE WRITTEN IN SIMPLE AND READABLE PLAIN LANGUAGE; AND

(2) CONTAIN SUFFICIENT DETAIL TO FULLY INFORM CONSUMERS ABOUT THE RIGHTS AND REMEDIES AVAILABLE UNDER THIS SUBTITLE AND THE PROCEDURES TO FOLLOW TO ENFORCE THOSE RIGHTS AND REMEDIES.

(C) EACH DEALER THAT SELLS A NEW MOTOR VEHICLE IN THE STATE SHALL PROVIDE TO THE PURCHASER, AT THE TIME OF THE SALE OR DELIVERY OF THE MOTOR VEHICLE, A COPY OF THE NOTICE DEVELOPED BY THE MOTOR VEHICLE ADMINISTRATION UNDER THIS SECTION.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Motor Vehicle Administration shall consult with the Consumer Protection Division of the Office of the Attorney General in developing the consumer notice required under Section 1 of this Act.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 1998.

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed House Bill 218.

This bill extends the deadline for the Board of Directors of the Baltimore Streetcar Museum, Inc. to provide up to \$190,000 in matching funds from June 1, 1998 to June 1, 2000.

Senate Bill 431, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me on April 14, 1998, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign House Bill 218.

AN ACT concerning

Baltimore Streetcar Museum Loan of 1996

FOR the purpose of amending Chapter 149 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1996, the Baltimore Streetcar Museum Loan of 1996, to extend the time by
