SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

**Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages**

5-201.

(p) (1) This subsection applies only in Kent County.

(2) The annual license fee is \$1,000.

(3) Any restaurant qualifying under § 6-201(p)(2)(ii) AND (III) of this article may apply to the Board of License Commissioners for a special Class B beer and light wine license.

6-201.

(p) (1) (i) This subsection applies only in Kent County.

(2) (ii) To qualify for licensure under this subsection, the restaurant shall:

1. Be fully equipped with a proper and adequate dining room;
2. Have sufficient facilities for preparing and serving meals to the public; and
3. Be approved by the Board.

(iii) When operating under this license, a holder's average daily receipts from the sale of food shall comprise at least 60 percent of the average daily receipts of the business.
