Laws of Montgomery County, 1997

AN ACT to:

(1) provide that a surviving spouse (or certain surviving children, if there is no surviving spouse) is the designated beneficiary for death benefits if the [[employee]] member did not designate a beneficiary or the designation was not [[effective]] enforceable;

(2) provide for alternate default beneficiaries when a designated beneficiary of a death benefit dies after the member but before benefit payments begin;

(3) provide for default beneficiaries for death benefits when the deceased member leaves no enforceable designation of beneficiaries, no surviving spouse, and no surviving child eligible for an annuity;

(4) apply the default designated beneficiary provisions retroactively to benefits based on the death of a member before January 1, 1995;

(5) provide that, until a certain date, the County must notify certain people affected by the retroactive provisions of this Act about the new rules and allow affected people to file an election of benefits or any other necessary documents;
