(d) Any commissioner convicted of violating subsection (a) [or (b)] of this section is guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall be punishable by a fine of not more than \$1,000 or six months in jail, or both fine and imprisonment, or by suspension from the commission or employment for not more than six months, or by outright forfeiture and removal from office, or by any combination of these, as in the discretion of the court is fit and proper.

(b) Whenever any appeal is taken, a copy thereof shall be served on the district council in the manner provided in [Rule B2 c of the Maryland Rules of Procedure] MARYLAND RULE 7-202(D), and the district council shall promptly give notice of the appeal to all parties to the proceeding before it and, within 30 days after the filing of the appeal, shall file with the courts the originals or certified copies of all papers and evidence presented to the council in the proceeding before it, together with a copy of its opinion and resolution deciding the application. Any party to the proceedings in the circuit court aggrieved by the decision of the court may appeal from the decision to the Court of Special Appeals. The review proceedings provided by this section are exclusive.
