- (A) An individual who is employed as a domestic servant in a private home is a covered employee with respect to a household if the individual earns at least \$750 in cash in a calendar quarter from that household.
- (B) (1) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (2) (3) OF THIS SUBSECTION, AN INDIVIDUAL AND THE EMPLOYER OF THE INDIVIDUAL MAY ELECT TO MAKE THE INDIVIDUAL A COVERED EMPLOYEE BY FILING A JOINT ELECTION WITH THE COMMISSION, IF THE INDIVIDUAL:
- (I) IS EMPLOYED AS A DOMESTIC SERVANT IN A PRIVATE HOME;
- (II) WOULD NOT BE A COVERED EMPLOYEE WITH RESPECT TO A HOUSEHOLD UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION BECAUSE THE INDIVIDUAL EARNS LESS THAN \$750 IN CASH IN A CALENDAR QUARTER FROM THAT HOUSEHOLD.
- (2) THE RIGHT TO MAKE AN ELECTION UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION FOR AN INDIVIDUAL MAY BE EXERCISED BY:
 - (I) AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS AT LEAST 16 YEARS OLD; OR
- $\underline{\mbox{(II)}}$ $\underline{\mbox{ A PARENT OR GUARDIAN OF AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS LESS THAN}}$ 16 YEARS OLD.
- (2) (3) FOR AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS NOT A COVERED EMPLOYEE DUE TO § 9–223(C) OF THIS SUBTITLE, AN EMPLOYER MAY NOT MAKE AN ELECTION UNDER THIS SUBSECTION IF PROHIBITED BY FEDERAL LAW.
