2-107. COMPENSATION.

(A) IN GENERAL.

EACH COMMISSIONER, THE CHAIRMAN OF THE COMMISSION, THE GENERAL COUNSEL, THE EXECUTIVE SECRETARY, AND THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ARE ENTITLED TO COMPENSATION AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET.

(B) MINIMUM SALARY.

- (1) THE SALARY OF THE CHAIRMAN OF THE COMMISSION SHALL BE AT LEAST \$40,000 A YEAR.
- (2) THE SALARY OF EACH COMMISSIONER SHALL BE AT LEAST \$35,000 A YEAR.
 - (C) REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES.

A COMMISSIONER AND OTHER COMMISSION PERSONNEL ARE ENTITLED TO REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES UNDER THE STANDARD STATE TRAVEL REGULATIONS, AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET.

REVISOR'S NOTE: This section is new language derived without substantive change from former Art. 78, § 7, the second sentence of § 12, and, as they related to compensation, § 9, and the first sentence of § 11A.

In subsection (b)(2) of this section, the former reference to the other "full-time" commissioners is deleted as unnecessary in light of the requirement that all commissioners serve full-time. See, § 2-102(c) of this title.

In subsection (c) of this section, the former reference to expenses incurred "while engaged in the performance of their duties" is deleted as included in the reference to reimbursement "under the Standard State Travel Regulations".

Also in subsection (c) of this section, the reference to "other Commission personnel" is added for clarity.
