FOR the purpose of making it a felony to attend a deglight or a cockfight under certain circumstances; altering the penalty certain penalties for knowingly attending a deliberately conducted doglight or a deliberately conducted event that uses a fowl, cock, or other bird to fight another fowl, cock, or other bird; and generally relating to penalties for attendance at a doglight or a cockfight.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## Article - Criminal Law

10-605.

- (a) A person may not knowingly attend a deliberately conducted dogfight as a spectator.
- (b) A person may not knowingly attend as a spectator a deliberately conducted event that uses a fowl, cock, or other bird to fight with another fowl, cock, or other bird.
- (c) (1) A person who violates this section is guilty of a [misdemeanor] FELONY and on conviction is subject to imprisonment not exceeding [90 days] 3 YEARS 1 YEAR or a fine not exceeding [\$1,000] \$5,000 \$2,500 or both.
- (2) As a condition of sentencing, the court may order a defendant convicted of violating this section to participate in and pay for psychological counseling.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2008.
