administered during a certain period of time; requiring the report to include certain information about certain examinees in a certain manner; requiring the Commissioner or a designee of the Commissioner on or before a certain date each year to prepare and make available on request a certain report that relates to a certain test form used for certain examinations administered during a certain period of time; requiring the report to show certain information about certain test forms for certain examinees in a certain manner; requiring the Commissioner or a designee of the Commissioner to submit the report to certain legislative committees; providing for the termination of this Act; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to reports on examinations for insurance producers.

Article – Insurance Section 10–109 Annotated Code of Maryland (2003 Replacement Volume and 2007 Supplement)

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Insurance

10-109.

- (a) An individual applicant who otherwise qualifies for a license for life insurance, health insurance, annuities, nonprofit health service plans, dental plan organizations, or health maintenance organizations is entitled to be examined as provided in this section.
- (b) (1) Each individual applicant must pass a personal written examination to determine:
- (i) the competence of the applicant as to life insurance, health insurance, or annuities or to any subdivision of them, including contracts for nonprofit health service plans, vision plans, dental plan organizations, and health maintenance organizations; and
- (ii) the familiarity of the applicant with the applicable laws of the State.
- (2) Each examination must be graded within 30 days after the date of the examination.
