- (c) The Governor shall designate the chair of the Task Force.
- (d) The Motor Vehicle Administration shall provide staff for the Task Force.
- (e) A member of the Task Force:
  - (1) may not receive compensation as a member of the Task Force; but
- (2) is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the Standard State Travel Regulations, as provided in the State budget.
  - (f) The Task Force shall study:
- (1) the State and local laws governing towing practices, including the storage and disposal of towed vehicles, and any recommended changes to these laws;
- (2) the costs, benefits, and feasibility of a State program of licensure or registration for the towing industry;
- (3) issues related to notice given by a private property owner to the owner of a motor vehicle before towing the vehicle;
- (4) issues related to notice given by a police department to the motor vehicle owner, a secured party, or an insurer of an abandoned motor vehicle in police custody;
- (5) issues related to notice given by a private tower to the motor vehicle owner, a secured party, an insurer, or the local police department of a towed vehicle in the possession of a private tower;
- (6) issues related to State preemption of local authority governing the towing or removal of motor vehicles; and
- (7) any other issues that the Task Force considers relevant to motor vehicle towing practices in the State.
- (g) On or before December 31, 2008, the Task Force shall report its findings and recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 2008. It shall remain effective for a period of <del>7 months</del> <u>1 year</u> and, at the end of <del>December 31, 2008</del> <u>May 31, 2009</u>, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
