- (2) STUDYING-LINKS BETWEEN REIMBURSEMENT POLICIES FOR TREATMENT OF CHILDHOOD OBESITY AS A PRIMARY DIAGNOSIS AND HOW IT AFFECTS THE ACCESS OF CHILDREN TO PUBLICLY AND PRIVATELY FUNDED HEALTH-CARE:
- (3) STUDYING-REQUIREMENTS FOR PHYSICAL EDUCATION IN THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS OF THE STATE AND HOW THEY AFFECT RATES OF CHILDHOOD OBESITY:
  - (4) INVESTIGATING PRACTICES IN OTHER STATES;
- (5) EXPLORING WAYS TO INCREASE PUBLIC AWARENESS-OF-THE PROBLEMS SURROUNDING CHILDHOOD OBESITY AND THE INCREASED NUMBER OF CHILDREN DEVELOPING DIABETES:
- (6) EXPLORING THE FEASIBILITY OF THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION CREATING AND PROMOTING A HEALTHY SCHOOLS INITIATIVE PROGRAM WITH AWARDS FOR PERFORMANCE AND RESULTS:
- (7) DEVELOPING A SYSTEM FOR COLLECTING, ANALYZING, AND MAINTAINING STATEWIDE DATA:
- (8) DEVELOPING WAYS TO PROMOTE THE BETTER USE OF AFTER SCHOOL FACILITIES AND SHARED FACILITIES WITH THE COMMUNITY FOR PHYSICAL ACTIVITIES:
- (9) EXPLORING WAYS TO ENCOURAGE SCHOOLS, RESTAURANTS, AND THE FOOD INDUSTRY TO INCREASE THE NUMBER AND VARIETY OF NUTRITIOUS FOOD OFFERINGS: AND
- (10) STUDYING THE FEASIBILITY OF MANDATING BODY MASS INDEX SCREENING IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS AND HOW THE SCREENING INFORMATION WOULD BE USED.
- (G) THE TASK FORCE SHALL REPORT ITS FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE GOVERNOR AND, SUBJECT TO § 2-1246 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY, ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 31, 2009.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2008. It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and, at the end of June 30, 2010, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
