SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2002. It shall remain effective for a period of [5 years and 8 months] 8 YEARS and, at the end of [May 31, 2008] SEPTEMBER 30, 2010 with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 2008.

## CHAPTER 651

(House Bill 235)

AN ACT concerning

Maryland Medical Assistance Program - Emergency Service Transporters Payments <u>Transporters</u>

FOR the purpose of repealing the statutory cap on reimbursement by the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene for emergency service transporters under the Maryland Medical Assistance Program and replacing it with a cap as specified by regulation adopted by the Department; requiring the Department, in consultation with certain stakeholders, to study certain issues regarding the creation of a uniform nonemergency statewide transportation program to serve enrollees of the Maryland Medical Assistance Program; requiring the Department to report certain findings to certain committees of the General Assembly on or before a certain date; and generally relating to emergency service transporters for enrollees of the Maryland Medical Assistance Program.
