

(22) Refuses, withholds from, denies, or discriminates against a patient or client with regard to the provision of professional services for which the licensee is licensed and qualified to render because the patient or client is HIV positive;

(23) Provides professional services while:

(i) Under the influence of alcohol; or

(ii) Using any narcotic or controlled dangerous substance, as defined in § 5-101 of the Criminal Law Article, or other drug that is in excess of therapeutic amounts or without valid medical indication;

(24) Willfully and without legal justification, fails to cooperate with a lawful investigation conducted by the Board; or

(25) Fails to meet accepted standards in delivering physical therapy or limited physical therapy care.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2008.

CHAPTER 658

(House Bill 280)

AN ACT concerning

Tax Credits for Qualifying Employees with Disabilities – Sunset Extension

FOR the purpose of extending certain termination provisions and dates of applicability for certain tax credits allowed to employers that hire certain qualifying individuals with disabilities; and generally relating to certain tax credits allowed to employers that hire certain qualifying employees facing certain employment barriers.
