SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That § 10-211.1(c)(1) and (2) of the Tax — General Article, as enacted by Section 1 of this Act, shall take effect January 1, 2011, and shall be applicable to all taxable years beginning after December 31, 2010.

SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, notwithstanding any other provision of law, for fiscal years 2010 and 2011, up to \$300,000 each year shall be transferred from the Maryland Health Care Provider Rate Stabilization Fund established under Title 19, Subtitle 8 of the Insurance Article to the Office of the Comptroller to pay only for mailings of applications and enrollment instructions for the Maryland Medical Assistance Program and the Maryland Children's Health Program, in accordance with § 10–211.1 of the Tax – General Article, as enacted by Section 1 of this Act.

SECTION 5. 6. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That § 10-211.1(b) and (c)(3) and (4) of the Tax—General Article, as enacted by Section 1 of this Act shall take effect January 1, 2009, and shall be applicable to all-taxable years beginning after December 31, 2008.

SECTION 6. AND BE-IT-FURTHER-ENACTED, That, except-as-provided in Sections-4 and 5 of this Act, this Act shall take effect July 1, 2008. It shall remain effective for a period of 3 years and, at the end of June 30, 2011, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.

Department of Health and Mental Hygiene and Maryland Health Quality and

Cost Council - Chronic Care Management Plan

FOR the purpose of requiring the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene and the Maryland Health Quality and Cost Council to study chronic care management and develop a certain chronic care management plan; requiring the chronic care management plan to include certain plans; requiring the Department and the Council to consult with certain persons in developing the chronic care
