Robert Ryan aged about thirty five years five feet nine and a half inches high the little finger of the left hand crooked from the first joint and an enlargement of the right fore finger and very dark complexion - is the identical negro manumitted by Eleanor Williams by deed of Manumission executed on the fourth day of November eighteen hundred and fifty two and recorded among the Chattel records of Howard County in Liber E.P.H. No. 2 folio Certificate issued on the first day of December 1852 upon the affidavit of Thomas L. Young.

Ann Dent aged about twenty five years five feet five inches high of black complexion a scar across the throat is the identical negro manumitted by Eleanor Williams by deed of Manumission executed on the fourth day of November 1852. and recorded among the Chattel records of Howard County in Liber E.P.H. No. 2 folio Certificate issued on the first day of December 1852. upon the affidavit of Thomas L. Young.

Mary Dent aged about twenty three years five feet six and a half inches high of black complexion a scar over the left eye is the identical negro manumitted by Eleanor Williams by deed of Manumission executed on the fourth day of November 1852. and recorded among the Chattel records of Howard County in Liber E.P.H. No. 2 folio Certificate issued upon the affidavit of Thomas L. Young.

William Boon aged twenty one years five feet eight inches high a scar in the left eye brown dark complexion, ^{spears badly} born free. Certificate issued on the 17th of December 1852 on the affidavit of Henry W. Warfield
