

Isaacks one black mare 85 dollars, 85, Executors, Administrators and assigns, one gray horse 80 dol. one brown mare 40 dollars - 40 - three cows 60 dollars 60 one waggon 35 dollars - 35. one small spring waggon 25 dollars - 25 one lot of Wheelite timber 30 dollars - 30 - 300.50 To have and to hold the said described the said property above mentioned and sold to the said John H. Isaacks, John H. Isaacks his heirs to the said Executors, Administrators and assigns forever; and the said Joseph Isaacks for myself my heirs, Executors and Administrators, the said Joseph Isaacks, unto the said John H. Isaacks his Executors and Administrators and assigns, against the said Joseph Isaacks his Executors and Administrators, and against all and every other person or persons whatsoever, shall and will warrant and forever defend by these presents;
