yearling; two Shoats; a lot of wood for Chair-matting;  
one Satchel & set of Tools; four Tables, four Bedsteads & bedding;  
a lot of Cooking Utensils; ten Chairs; four rocking do;  
one eight-day Clock; one looking-Glass; one lot of garden  
Utensils; one Sleigh; one set of Poultry & set of Books.

October Eighteen hundred and fifty seven.
