To have and to hold the same to wit, the said Negro girl and the said issue as aforesaid unto the said Wilson Mc Bee his executors, administrators and assigns in manner and form as aforesaid. In witness whereof the said Anna Maria Hopkins and the said Wilson Mc Bee have hereunto subscribed their names and affixed their seals this thirtieth day of May in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and fifty four.
