



Hearn as Justices of the Peace of said County, by virtue of the power and authority to them given, in and by an act of the General Assembly, passed at November Session in the year one thousand seven hundred and ninety four, entitled a supplement to the act entitled an act for the better regulation of Apprentices, have placed and bound out, and by these presents do place and bind out as an apprentice Margaret Yogood, who on the first day of April next, will be of the age of seven years the daughter of Eliza Yogood of the said County, of Indigent Circumstances with the consent and approbation of said Eliza Yogood to learn the art trade and mystery of House Keeping after the manner of an apprentice; the said Margaret Yogood, to dwell with and serve the John L. Hay from the date of these presents until the first day of April in the year of eight hundred and seventy one when the said Margaret Yogood shall attain to the age of eighteen years during all which time and term the said Margaret Yogood shall the said John L. Hay well and faithfully serve in all such lawful business as the Margaret Yogood shall be put unto by her said master according to the power and ability of her the said Margaret Yogood and honestly and obediently in all things shall behave herself toward her said master, and honestly and obediently toward the rest of the family of the said John L. Hay.

And the said John L. Hay on his part doth hereby promise and agree to teach and instruct the said apprentice or cause her to be taught and instructed in the art trade or calling of house Keeping by the best way, or manner he can and shall well and faithfully find and provide for the said apprentice good and sufficient meat, drink, clothing, lodging and other necessaries fit and convenient for such an apprentice during the term aforesaid and at the expiration thereof shall give unto the said apprentice two suits of wearing apparel one suitable for Sunday, and the other for working days and eighteen dollars as her freedom dues.
