of Howard County Maryland do hereby bargain and Sell to the Said Gustavus Sucker a Negro Slave Luke belonging to me the Said Michael McHoller to Serve until the eleven th day of January in the year eighteen hundred and Sixty five the Said Negro being a Slave until Said 11<sup>th</sup> day of January in the year eighteen hundred and Sixty five and no longer and the Said Michael McHoller being entitled to the Whole of Said term of Services of Said Slave as bill of Sale to Said M McHoller by Executor of Elizabeth Nelson died Witness our hands and Seals this 9<sup>th</sup> day of July 1860
