 it known that I George Bradford
 of Howard County, in the state of
 Maryland for divers good causes
 and considerations me there-
 unto moving as also in further consideration
 of one dollar current money, to me in hand
 paid have released from slavery, liberated
 Manumitted and set free and by these presents
 do hereby release from slavery, liberate man-
 mit and set free my negro woman named
 Rachael being of the age of thirty eight years and
 and able to work and gain a sufficient live-
 lihood and maintenance, and her two children
 namely Martha and Perry, and her the said
 negro woman named Rachel and her two
 children namely Martha and Perry. I do
 declare to be henceforth free Manumit-
 ted and discharged from all manner of
 servitude or service to me my executors
 or administrators forever. In testimony
 whereof I have herewith set my hands
 and affixed my seal this tenth day of
 October in the year of our Lord eighteen hun-
 dred and fifty four.
