Mr. Barnes, the chairman of the committee to whom the subject was referred, reported a bill, entitled, An act to authorise Catharine Cunningham, James Cunningham and Edward Campbell, of Frederick county, or some person or persons for them, to mortgage certain real estate for the purposes therein mentioned.

Mr. S. R. Smith, chairman of the committee therein mentioned, de-

livered the following report:

The committee to whom were referred the petitions of the trustees of the Union Academy, of the Buckingham Academy, and of the Salisbury Academy, report—

That they have had the same under consideration, consider the prayers of the same reasonable and just, and therefore beg leave to submit

the following resolution:

Resolved by the general assembly of Maryland, That the treasurer of the western shore pay to the trustees of the Union Academy, to the Buckingham Academy, and to the Salisbury Academy, all of them being situated in Worcester county, the sum of eight hundred dollars, on or before the first day of June next, and on or before the first day of June annually thereafter, in the following manner, to wit:

To the trustees of the Union Academy, or to their order, the sum of three hundred dollars; to the trustees of the Buckingham Academy, or to their order, the sum of three hundred dollars; and to the trustees of the Salisbury Academy, or to their order, the sum of two hundred dol-

lars.

On motion by Mr. Tyson, the unfinished business of yesterday, as regards the bill which was made the order for that day, entitled. An act to incorporate the members of the Independent Odd Fellows Society, was postponed until to-morrow.

Ordered, That the members of the Odd Fellows Society be required to lay their constitution and by-laws before this house forthwith.

Which was read and afterwards withdrawn at the request of the mov-

er, and by the permission of the house.

The house proceeded to ballot for bank directors on the part of the state, and the members having deposited their ballots in the ballot box, the gentlemen named by this house, conjointly with those appointed in the senate, to count the votes, and report the result, retired to the conference room.
