other states the power to take acknowledgments of deeds to pass lands

lying within this state.

The senate also think, that there will be less opportunity for the commission of fraud in the acknowledgment of deeds out of the state, if the power of taking the acknowledgment of them is restricted, as it now is, by the said bill.

The bill and amendments are therefore returned to your honourable body, with the hope and expectation that you will adopt the amend-

ments made by the senate.
