On motion by Mr. Speed, the question was put, That the following be added to the 26th section: "Provided, that no other rule of apportionment of the funds, which have heretofore been raised, or which may hereafter be raised under the provisions of said acts, than as, in such acts is provided, shall be applied to said funds." Resolved in the affirmative.

On motion by Mr. Tyson, the following was inserted in the 27th section. after the words "counties of this state," to wit. "When the said city shall have established public schools, either by authority delegated to the said city, or under this act, and to the city of Baltimore."

Mr. Howard moved to reconsider the 26th section? Determined in

the negative.

Mr. Perry moved to strike out the following section as amended:

"Sec. 27. And be it enacted. That all the funds hereafter to be assigned and appropriated for the support and maintenance of public instruction, as relating to primary schools, shall be apportioned and distributed amongst the several counties of this state, according to the ratio of white population, as ascertained by the last preceding census of the United States; and it shall be the duty of the superintendant of public instruction, to give notice thereof, in writing, to each of the clerks of the county courts of such counties, setting forth the amount of money apportioned to his county, and the time when the same shall be payable to the commissioners of said county."
