Mr. Kershner reports the bill authorising the levy court of Wash-ington county to levy a sum of money for the purpose of repairing and rebuilding a bridge over Conococheague creek, near the Broad Fording, as amended.

The additional supplement to an act, entitled, An act to incorporate the trustees of the Franklin Academy, or school, in Baltimore county, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

The report relative to the revision of the laws, was read the second time. Mr. Speed moved to amend the first resolution, so as to make it read, "Resolved, That Thomas Harris and John N. Watkins, be and they are hereby appointed to revise and digest."

When Mr. Barnes moved that the report and proposed amendment lie on the table. Resolved in the affirmative.

The report on the petition of sundry inhabitants of Church Hill and its vicinity praying for a part of the donation given to the Centreville academy, was read the second time.

Mr. Stevens moved to strike out all of the same from the word re-
port, to insert the following:

Whereas the citizens of Church Hill and its vicinity, with the trus-tees of said academy, have petitioned the legislature for a part of the donation given to the Centreville academy, under the impression that more beneficial effects would result to the community, and thereby give a greater scope to its usefulness, in the education of youth; and by the report of the trustees of the Centreville academy, made to the treasur-er of the western shore on the 26th day of December last, it appears that there were at that time only six classical scholars in that institution; therefore Resolved by the general assembly of Maryland. That the mo-ney appropriated by virtue of a resolution passed at November session 1811, No. 50, giving to the trustees of the Centreville academy the sum of \$800, shall be divided between the Centreville academy and the Church Hill academy, in the following proportions, viz. two thirds of said donation shall be paid to the trustees of the Centreville academy, or their order, and the remaining one third to the trustees of the Church Hill academy, or their order, at the time mentioned in said resolution, any thing in said resolution to the contrary notwithstanding.
