Mr. Teackle obtained leave to bring in a bill, entitled, An act to incorporate a society for the promotion of agriculture, manufactures, commerce, arts and literature, in this state. Ordered, That Messrs. Teackle, Tyson and McCulloh, report the same.

Mr. Cockey obtained leave to bring in a bill, entitled, A further additional supplement to an act, entitled, An act to incorporate the Westminster General Meeting House in Frederick county. Ordered, That Messrs. Cockey, Sappington and Barnes, report the same.

Mr. Cockey reports said bill; which was twice read by special order, passed, and sent to the senate.

The committee to whom was referred the petition of John Hanna, of the city of Baltimore, have had the same under consideration, and are of opinion, that the prayer of the petitioner is reasonable, they therefore recommend to the house the adoption of the following resolution:

Resolved, That the treasurer of the western shore be and he is hereby authorised and required, to pay to the said John Hanna, or his order, the sum of thirty-two dollars, out of any unappropriated money in the treasury.

Resolved, That executions against the securities of Thomas Pollard, late sheriff of Allegany county, on judgments obtained at the suit of, and in the name of, the state of Maryland, in Allegany county court, shall not issue or be levied before the first day of January 1827, provided that within two months from the passage of this resolution, they give bond, with security to be approved of by the clerk of Allegany county court, for the payment of the said debt, with the interest thereon, on or before the said first day of January 1827.

Mr. Thomas presents a petition from Richard Lockwood, praying to be authorised to remove certain negro slaves into this state; referred to Messrs. Thomas, Grubb and Harlan.

Mr. Potter from the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims, delivers the following report:

The committee on pensions and revolutionary claims, to whom was referred the petition of Daniel Spalding, of the city of Baltimore, have had the same under consideration, and beg leave to recommend the adoption of the following resolution:

Resolved, That the treasurer of the western shore pay to Daniel Spalding, of the city of Baltimore, or to his order, during life, in quarterly annual payments, the half pay of a private, as a further remuneration for his services during the revolutionary war.
