

Maryland, Mr. Teackle moved to strike out the first section, for the purpose of inserting the following:

“Sec. 1. Be it enacted by the general assembly of Maryland, That an annual entrance, or matriculation tax of five dollars, shall be, and the same is hereby imposed upon and required of, each and every pay student hereafter entered or matriculated in each of the faculties of law and physic of the University of Maryland.

2. And be it enacted, That an annual tax of ten per centum shall be and the same is hereby imposed upon the fee or fees of each of the several professors of each of the said faculties of law and physic, and upon every other compensation required for admission to the lectures, or operations, of the said professors, to be paid by the said professors respectively.

3. And be it enacted, That a tax of forty dollars shall be, and the same is hereby imposed on each and every diploma, or certificate of graduation, to be paid by each and every student of each of the said faculties, who shall, or may hereafter, graduate in the said University; beyond which no charge shall be imposed upon, or required of, any diploma, or certificate of graduation, excepting only the actual cost of parchment or paper, or other costs of the said instrument.

4. And be it enacted, That the several taxes hereby imposed and required, shall be paid to the treasurer, or other proper accounting officer of each of the said faculties, for the support and improvement of the University, whose receipt shall be good evidence of such payment, and it shall be the duty of the said accounting officer or officers, to report thereon, in detail, to the treasurer of the western shore, on or before the last day of November in every year hereafter.

5. And be it enacted, That it shall be the duty of each and every of the several professors of each of the said faculties of physic and law, to report to the said treasurer, on or before the last day of November in every year hereafter, the number of students admitted to attend their respective branches or departments, with the several names of the said students, distinguishing the pay, from the free students.

6. And be it enacted, That it shall be the duty of the said treasurer to make a report to the legislature, in the first week of every session, of all such information as he may receive in virtue of this act.”

A division was called for, and the question put on striking out. Determined in the negative.

The question was then put, Shall the bill pass? Resolved in the affirmative, and the bill returned to the senate.

The bill to regulate the guaging of casks, and the inspection of domestic distilled liquors, in the city of Baltimore, was read the second time.

Mr. Tyson moved to insert the words ‘and knowing it to be so fraudulently made,’ in the 3d clause after the word ‘cask.’ Determined in the negative.

On motion by Mr. Thomas, the words ‘and its contents’ were stricken out after the words “shall forfeit the cask,” and “five dollars” inserted.

Mr. Tyson moved to strike out the words ‘the intermediate degrees between the several proofs.’ Determined in the negative.
