

On motion by Mr. Lee, the following resolution was read, assented to, and sent to the senate.

Resolved, That the treasurer of the western shore pay to each member of the legislature, with the clerks and other officers, such per diem as they may be entitled to, since the closing of the journal of accounts up to the 11th of March, inclusive, and that the committee of claims furnish the said treasurer with a list of members, clerks and other officers, so entitled.

The supplement to an act, entitled, An act to reduce into one the several acts of assembly respecting elections, and to regulate said elections, was, on motion by Mr. Cockey, referred to the 1st of June next.

The additional supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the better regulation of the militia of the city of Baltimore, was read the second time, amended, passed, and sent to the senate.

The clerk of the senate returns the resolution in favour of Barbara Riley, endorsed 'dissented from.'

The resolutions in favour of the clerks, James Leonard, and Andrew Slicer and John Quynn, severally endorsed 'assented to.'

The resolution relative to the revision of the law, endorsed 'assented to with the proposed amendment;' which was read and assented to.

Also the bill for the relief of Mary Whitehill; the bill to prevent nuisances in Port Tobacco, in Charles county; the bill to authorise the levy court of Calvert county to sell the poor house, endorsed 'will pass.' Ordered to be engrossed. The supplement to an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from Boonsborough to Hager's-town, endorsed 'will not pass.' The bill appointing commissioners for the town of Oxford, and the supplement to an act relative to licenses, passed Dec. session 1824, chapter 148, endorsed 'will pass.' Ordered to be engrossed.

The bill relating to collectors of the public revenue; the bill to authorise the governor and council to appoint inspectors of salted fish; the bill to regulate the gauging of casks; the bill to establish district courts for trials of assault and battery; and the bill supplementary to an act, entitled, An act relating to justices of the peace in the city of Baltimore, severally endorsed 'will not pass.' And the following message:

By the Senate, March 9, 1826.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,

The senate having disposed of nearly all the business before them, propose, with the concurrence of your house, to invite his excellency the governor to attend in the senate chamber at 12 o'clock, to sign and seal the engrossed bills, and to close the session this day.

Should these propositions receive your assent, the senate have appointed Messrs. Scott and Kent, to join such gentlemen as may be named by your honourable body, to wait upon his excellency.
