Know all men by these presents that we Philip Pindell and Elizabeth Pindell of Anne Arundel County and State of Maryland for and in consideration of the sum of five hundred dollars current money to us in hand paid by John F. Wilson and William Otarra of the County and State aforesaid at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof we the said Philip Pindell and Elizabeth Pindell do hereby acknowledge have granted bargained and sold and by these presents do grant bargain and sell unto John F. Wilson and William Otarra the following negroes slaves for life to wit negro man Dick aged about twenty years negro girl Peg aged about forty years, negro boy Casper aged about twelve years and negro boy Alfred aged eleven years, all of which negroes are now in our possession To have and to hold the said negroes to the said John F. Wilson and William Otarra their executors administrators and assigns forever and we the said Philip Pindell and Elizabeth Pindell for ourselves our heirs executors and administrators, the aforesaid negroes to the said John F. Wilson and William Otarra their executors administrators and assigns, against us the said Philip Pindell and Elizabeth Pindell our executors and administrators and against all and every person whomsoever shall and will warrant and forever defend by these presents Provided nevertheless that in case the said Philip Pindell and Elizabeth Pindell shall indemnify and save harmless the said John F. Wilson and William Otarra as their securities to a negotiable note in the Farmers Bank of Maryland for the sum of Three hundred and sixty eight dollars then and in that case this Bill of sale to be void and of no effect otherwise to remain in full force and virtue in law. In Testimony whereof we have hereunto set our hands and affixed our seals this 13th day of November Eighteen hundred and twenty nine.
