To Have and To Hold the same described above bargained and sold to the said Joseph Ward his executors, administrators and assigns forever to his and their only proper use and benefit. and I the said Richard Beard for myself my executors <sup>and</sup> administrators shall and will warrant and forever defend by these presents to the said Joseph Ward his executors administrators & assigns the said described property against me my executors and administrators and against all and every other person or persons whomsoever claiming the same or any part thereof.
