Know all men by these presents that I Philip Pettibone of Anne Arundel County for and in consideration of the sum of Two hundred and eighteen dollars current money to me in hand paid by Hamilton P Moss of said County at or before the sealing and delivering of these presents the receipt whereof I the said Philip Pettibone do hereby acknowledge have granted, bargained and sold and by these presents do grant, bargain and sell unto the said Hamilton P Moss his Executors administrators and assigns the following negro to wit one negro boy named Jacob age about twenty one to serve until thirty, to have and to hold the said negro above bargained and sold or mentioned or intended so to be to the said Hamilton P Moss his Executors, administrators and assigns forever and I the said Philip Pettibone for myself my heirs executors and administrators all and singular the said negro unto the said Hamilton P Moss his executors administrators and assigns against me the said Philip Pettibone my executors and administrators against all and every other person and persons whatsoever shall and will warrant and former defend by these presents of all and singular which said negro I the said Philip Pettibone have put the said Hamilton P Moss in full possession by delivering to him the said Hamilton P Moss one dollar at the sealing and delivering of these presents hereby bargained and sold or intended so to be unto him the said Hamilton P Moss as aforesaid. Provided always and it is the true intent and meaning of these presents that if the said Philip Pettibone shall fail to pay the above mentioned sum of money before the twenty fifth day of September Eighteen hundred and thirty then the aforesaid negro to be considered as the property of the said Hamilton P Moss any thing in the above mentioned premises to the contrary notwithstanding. In witness whereof I the said Philip Pettibone have hereto set my hand and seal the day and year above mentioned.
