This Indenture Made this twenty fourth day of December in the year
of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty nine Queen
Charles G Worthington of Anne Arundel County in the State of Maryland
of the one part And William D Bowie of Prince Georges County of the
same State of the other part witnesseth that the said Charles G.
Worthington for and in Consideration of the sum of three hundred
dollars current money of the United States, whom I have paid at or
before the sealing and delivery of these presents by the said William D
Bowie Trustee as herein after mentioned out of the separate Estate and
property of Anne D Worthington wife of the said Charles G Worthington
and for and in Consideration of the further sum of one dollar whom
I have paid out of the proper money of the said William D Bowie
the receipt whereof which sum the said Charles G Worthington
doth hereby acknowledge hath granted bargained and sold and
by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said William
D Bowie his executors and administrators a mulatto girl named Ellen
now about thirteen years of age to have and to hold the said mulatto
girl unto the said William D Bowie his executors and administrators in
trust nevertheless for the sole and separate use and enjoyment of the
said Anne D Worthington for and during the term of her natural life
Provided always that the said Anne D Worthington shall have full
power and authority to dispose of the said mulatto girl by last will
and testament to whomsoever she may think proper and in default of
any such appointment then the said mulatto girl shall descend as
