

in this Bill of sale to the said Charly & Gosnell her executors administrators and assigns forever and I the said Dennis Mc Battle for myself my heirs executors and administrators the aforesaid property as already specified and named to the said Charly & Gosnell her executors administrators and assigns against me the said Dennis Mc Battle my executors and administrators and against all and every person and persons whomsoever shall and will bear and/or defend by these presents I do de declare nevertheless that in case the said Dennis Mc Battle shall pay and satisfy to the said Charly & Gosnell or to her executors administrators and assigns the sum of one hundred and Ninety three dollars with interest forth same for which sum the said Charly & Gosnell now holds my note bearing the same date with this bill of sale when said note is paid and settled then or before the 13th of October 1844 then this bill of sale and every matter and thing therein expressed shall be void and of no effect it being the true intent and meaning thereof that the said property as named and specified in this bill of sale is mortgaged by me the said Dennis Mc Battle to secure the said Charly & Gosnell the payment of the money aforesaid. In witness whereof I the said Dennis Mc Battle have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 13 day of October 1844.

administrators and assigns one negro man named Frederick one negro man named
such one negro girl named Grace and one negro girl named Nancy which slaves
are now in my possession together with their increase to have and to hold the said
negro slaves and their increase unto the use of the said St. Leger his executors
administrators and assigns
