 use intent or purpose what so ever In Testimony whereof I have hereunto
 subscribed my name and affixed my seal this 25th day of January Eighteen hundred
 and forty three

 presents do grant bargain and sell unto the said Richard C. Hardesty his Executors
 administrators and assigns all of my crop of Tobacco made on the farm upon which
 I now reside in the year Eighteen hundred and forty two part of said Tobacco as
 now hanging in a house upon the farm of John Wesley Whitworth, part now on house
 upon the farm of Co^l Robert W. Hunt and the balance hanging in houses upon the
 farm on which I reside I do have and to hold the same described Tobacco above
 bargained and sold unto the said Richard C. Hardesty his Executors administrators
 and assigns forever to his and their only proper use and behoof And I the said
 Thomas A. Stockell for my self my Executors and administrators shall and will
 warrant and forever defend by these presents to the said Richard C. Hardesty his
