the said negro woman Rebecca with the premises above bargained and sold
or continued or extended so to hold to the said W^{ash} Co Hodges his executor
administrators and assigns for ever and the said Edward Jacob for
myself my heirs executors and administrators all and singular the said
negro woman named Rebecca aged about twenty years unto the said W^{ash} Co
Hodges his executor and administrators and against all other persons and
every person what so ever shall and lawfully warrant and forever defend by these
presents of all and singular the said negro woman named Rebecca aged
about twenty years and the said Edward Jacob have put the said W^{ash} Co Hodges
in possession by delivering the said negro woman named Rebecca aged about
twenty years at the making and delivery of these presents In Witness whereof
the said Edward Jacob have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this
fifth day of April eighteen hundred and forty six
