have hereunto subscribed their names and affixed their several seals on the first day
of September in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty four

the receipt whereof said coville by acknowledging do give to the said Thomas
by a decree of the high Court of Chancery of Maryland bearing date on the nineteenth
day of July eight hundred and fifty three in and with the said Coville defendant
between the said Johnson and Alexander Complainants and Richard S Coville
defendant the said Johnson and Alexander were appointed trustees to sell the real
and personal property within and among and from the premises and where
on the fifth day of September in the year of our said the said trustees in pursuance
of the said decree did sell and dispose of to the said Richard S Coville a Negro
man named George about twenty four years of age for the sum of one hundred
