


of age Charlotte about three years of age and Lucy about two years of age

 his executors administrators and assigns from the day of the date of these  
 presents as follows To have until the eighth day of March eighteen hundred  
 and sixty two Charlotte until the fifth day of May eighteen hundred and  
 eighty and Lucy until the second day of September eighteen hundred and  
 eighty one and no longer And he it further know that from and after  
 the said last mentioned day in each case and to date and take effect from  
 and upon the same and not before I hereby for divers good and sufficient  
 causes and considerations me thereunto moving manumit release from  
 slavery and servitude liberate and set free the said female slaves named  
 Lillian Charlotte and Lucy and them the said female slaves I declare to be  
 thenceforth freed manumitted and discharged from all manner of service  
 or servitude whatsoever to me my executors administrators and assigns the  
 witness whereof I hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty ninth  
 day of December eighteen hundred and forty six


