



 these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted bargain  
 and sold and by these presents do grant bargain and sell unto the said Randolph  
 S. Cromwell his executor administrators and assigns one negro man named  
 Allick about twenty five years old of the property of Charles Waters late of the  
 City of Baltimore deceased as a slave to serve until the first day of May  
 eighteen hundred and fifty seven (1857) and thereafter to be free and discharged  
 from all manner of servitude agreeably to the form and effect of the last  
 will and testament of the said dec'd. The said negro man being sold and conveyed  
 by me as Executor and administrator of the form and authority vested in me by  
 said last will and testament. To Have and To Hold the said described negro man  
 Allick for the term aforesaid but no longer to the said Randolph S. Cromwell  
 his Executor administrators and assigns as aforesaid In Witness whereof we have  
 hereunto set our hands and seals this fifth day of February eighteen hundred  
 and fifty seven
