 and assigns against me the said Editha Williams my Executors
 and administrators and against all and every person and persons
 whomsoever shall and will warrant and defend depend by their
 presents Provided nevertheless that in case the said Editha Wil-
 liams shall pay and satisfy to the said Nicholas W. Goldborough
 or his executors administrators or assigns the sum of four hundred
 dollars current money with interest for the same or a before
 the first day of January eighteen hundred and forty nine then
 this bill of sale and every matter and thing therein expressed
 shall be void and of none effect it being the true intent and
 meaning thereof that the said negroes Rose Henry Richard and
 George are mortgaged by me the said Editha Williams to be used
 to the said Nicholas W. Goldborough the payments of the money
 aforesaid. In witness whereof the said Editha Williams have
 hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal the twenty eighth day of
 April eighteen hundred and forty seven
