

Bill of Sale from John W. Duvall To John S. Sellman

Know all men by these presents that John W. Duvall of Anne Arundel County and state of Maryland, for and in consideration of the sum of fifteen dollars current money and also

fifteen barrels of corn value of sixty dollars current money, making together seventy five dollars to me in hand paid by John S. Sellman of the county and state aforesaid, at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof I the said John W. Duvall do hereby acknowledge, have granted, bargained, and sold, and by these presents do grant bargain and sell unto the said John S. Sellman his executors, administrators, and assigns, all of my crop of tobacco of the growth of the year eighteen hundred and forty six supposed to be about four thousand pounds, all and singular which said tobacco is now in my possession. To Have and to hold all and singular the tobacco above bargained and sold, or mentioned and intended, so to be to the said John S. Sellman his Executors, administrators, and assigns forever, and I the said John W. Duvall, for myself, my heirs Executors and administrators all and singular the said tobacco unto John S. Sellman his Executors, administrators and assigns, against me the said John W. Duvall, my Executors and administrators, and against all and singular persons or persons whatsoever shall and will warrant and forever defend by these presents, of all and singular which said tobacco, I the said John W. Duvall have—
