To have and to hold all and singular the said Corns and tobacco above bargained and sold, or mentioned and intended so to be, to the said Randall, and House their Executors, administrators and assigns forever and the said Elijah Randall for myself, my heirs Executors and Administrators all and singular the said Corn, Oats and tobacco unto the said Randall and House their Executors administrators and assigns, against me the said Elijah Randall my Executors and administrators, and against all and every other person or persons whatsoever, shall and will warrant and force defend by these presents —

In Witness whereof I the said Elijah Randall have hereunto subscribed my name and affixed my seal this fourth day of August in the year of Our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and forty seven —
