Know all Men by These Presents— That I Philip D. Sutton of Anne Arundel County and State of Maryland. for and in consideration of the sum of One dollar lawful money of the United States, in hand paid by Andrew Armstrong as

Trustee for the Benefit of all (said Suttons) creditors at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged. Have granted, bargained and sold, and by these presents do grant bargain and sell unto the said Andrew Armstrong Trustee as aforesaid his Executors, administrators, and assigns, One bay horse aged about nine years One bay mare aged about eight years, One two horse Wagon, and all and every other species, of property whatsoever, whenever and wherever to be found, that is at this time owned held or claimed by me, the said Philip D. Sutton the said described property— To Have and To Hold as Trustee his Executors Administrators and assigns forever and I the said Philip D. Sutton for my self my Heirs, Executors and administrators, the said described property unto the said Andrew Armstrong Trustee his Executors, Administrators, and assigns, against me the said Philip D. Sutton my heirs my Executors and administrators and against all and every other person, or persons whatsoever, shall and will warrant and forever defend by these presents—
