
I know all men by these presents, that I James

current money to me in hand paid by Thomas C.

Pitcher of the County and State above named, the receipt of which
I do hereby acknowledge, have granted, bargained, sold, and delivered;
and by these presents, do grant, bargain sell and deliver, unto the
said Thomas C. Pitcher One Negro Boy, by the name of George, a Slave for
life, which Boy is not to be sold out of the State which said property shall
warrant and defend to the said Thomas C. Pitcher, his executors
Administrators, and assigns, against me, my executors, administrators
and against every other person, or persons whatsoever.

Seal this 1st day of January 1848.

Baltimore and state aforesaid at or before
the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby
acknowledged I have granted, bargained and sold, and by these
presents do grant bargain and sell, unto the said Henry Handy
his executors, Administrators and assigns ten carts, ten horses, four
Cows eleven sheep, one Settee, one carriage bedding and bedsteads
