Shall and will warrant and forever defend by these presents, In witness Whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and seal this Tenth day of April eighteen hundred and forty Eight

The interlining words between the Eleventh and twelfth lines (and all her increase) also between twenty first and twenty second lines (and her increase) were inserted before the acknowledgement thereof. And the Inventory was between the Fourteenth and fifteenth lines (20th day of January last) and between sixteenth and seventeen lines (on 11th day of February last) between fifteen and sixteen lines and then to go free. even all inserted in the Presence of the Parties concerned and at their request the alteration in the 11th line (word thirty) and also in the 12th line (word four) and also in the 13th line (words Forty Five) also in the 16th line (word five) and also in 1st line the word five, were all made at the request and in the presence of the Parties 6 May 1848.
