

Bill of Sale from William Bassford to J. D. Carr  
 I know all men by these presents that I William Bassford of Anne Arundel County and State of Maryland for and in consideration of the sum of forty dollars current money to me in hand paid by J. D. Carr of the County and State aforesaid at and before the sealing and delivering of these presents the receipt whereof the said William Bassford do hereby acknowledge have granted bargained and sold, and by these presents do grant, bargain and sell unto the said J. D. Carr his executors administrators and assigns all my right, title, interest and claim both at law and in equity of, in and to one third part of the crop of tobaccos, and one fourth part of the crop of corn now standing and growing upon the farm of a certain Lloyd Brown of the County aforesaid, and upon which said farm of the said William Bassford
