Benjamin Carrick This Indenture made this twenty seventh day of September in to the year eighteen hundred and forty eight ^{15 cent stamp} between Benjamin Carrick and Franklin Carrick son of Anne Arundel County State of Maryland of the one part and Franklin Carrick of said State and County of the other part, whereas the said Benjamin Carrick owes and stands justly indebted to the said Franklin Carrick in the sum of three hundred dollars current money and to secure the payment thereof is willing to execute these presents. Now this Indenture witnesseth that the said Benjamin Carrick for and in consideration of the premises and of the sum of five dollars current money to him in hand paid by the said Franklin Carrick at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents, doth grant bargain and sell by these presents and hath granted bargained and sold unto the said Franklin Carrick the entire crop of corn now growing upon the land supposed to be about one hundred barrels, one bay horse, one black mare, one pair of oxen, and of cast, three cows, twelve sheep, and household and kitchen furniture unto the said Franklin Carrick his executors, administrators and assigns to his own proper use and behoof. Provided always and it is declared to be the true intent and meaning of these presents that if the said Benjamin Carrick do and shall well and truly pay or cause to be paid to the said Franklin Carrick, his executors, administrators and assigns, the said sum of three hundred dollars, with legal interest for the same on or before the first day of January in the year eighteen hundred and forty nine, then and in that case these presents and every matter and thing herein contained, shall cease and be void, anything herein contained, to the contrary notwithstanding - and the said Benjamin Carrick for himself, his heirs, executors, administrators
