Arundel County in the State of Maryland for the consideration  
of the sum of three hundred and fifty five dollars lawful  
money to us in hand paid by Joshua Osborne of the County and State aforesaid  
the receipt whereof we do hereby acknowledge, have granted, bargained sold and delivered  
and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and deliver unto the said Joshua Os-  
borne our negro woman Harriet aged about eighteen years a slave for life, which  
said slave Harriet we will warrant and defend to the said Joshua Osborne his ex-  
ecutors, administrators and assigns against us our executors and administrators  
and against every other person or persons whomsoever. In Witness whereof  
we have hereunto respectively set our ~~hands~~ names and affixed our seals on this  
27<sup>th</sup> day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty nine

thereof and the acts of Assembly in such case made and provided - And the said  
Mary Ann upon being privately examined by me, declared that she did sign said  
and acknowledge said instrument of writing voluntarily and freely and with-  
out being induced thereto by fear or threats of or ill usage by her said husband or for

At the same time and place of the signing, sealing and delivering of the foregoing Bill  
of Sale, also appeared before me the subscriber, a Justice of the peace as aforesaid  
Joshua Osborne the grantee in the said Bill of Sale named, and made oath  
that the consideration set forth in the said Bill of Sale is true and bona fide
